The Prize:


"X is the programming language of choice for discriminating hackers."


This year: Mars Rover Control System.

- Organized by Portland State University / University of Chicago
- The task description was released at 5am, Saturday 12th July.
- There were 336 regular and 170 lightning round submissions.
- Submit code or an linux/x86 binary.

Mars Rover

- Get to the base as fast as you can, avoiding boulders, craters, and martians.
- Telemetry gives position of obstacles, control is Left/Right, Accel/Brake.

ASCII text, received over a TCP connection.






• ASCII commands to change state, sent back via TCP.




Solution: Collision Avoidance
